# **MURDER**

The classification of this offense is based solely on police investigation as opposed to the determination of a court, medical examiner, coroner, jury, or other judicial body. Deaths caused by negligence, suicide, accident, or justifiable homicide are not included in the offense of murder. Attempts and assaults to murder are classified as aggravated assaults and not as murder.


#### **MOTOR VEHICLE THEFT**

- The theft of a motor vehicle -

A motor vehicle is defined for UCR purposes as a self-propelled vehicle that runs on land surface and not on rails, and whose primary purpose is to transport persons. The following categories in this offense are: automobiles; buses; recreational vehicles; trucks; and other motor vehicles, i.e. motorcycles, scooters, mopeds, golf carts, snowmobiles, etc.

Tractors, farm and industrial equipment, and lawn mowers are not considered "motor vehicles" as the primary purpose is not to transport persons. Motor vehicle theft excludes taking for temporary use by those persons having lawful access to the vehicle. Included in the count of this offense is "joy riding".




