




Robbery is a violent confrontation between an offender and a victim; however, it is classified as a crime against property because the primary reason for committing the offense is to take something of value.

#### Robbery Incidents by Type of Weapons Used in 2009











**Distribution** 

A motor vehicle is defined for UCR purposes as a self-propelled vehicle that runs on land surface and not on rails, and whose primary purpose is to transport persons. Motorcycles, scooters, snow-mobiles, golf carts, etc. are categorized under "other motor vehicles." Recreational vehicles are specifically designed to transport people and also provide them temporary lodging for recreational purposes. Tractors, farm and industrial equipment, and lawn mowers are not considered "motor vehicles," as their main purpose is not to transport persons. Motor vehicle theft includes the offense of "joy riding."








#### Destruction of Property Arrests by Age in 2009








