For reporting purposes under the UCR/NIBRS rules and guidelines, all victims of crimes against society are classified as "society" victims. Individual data on persons directly and/or indirectly affected by a crime against society, such as pornography, is not collected.








2009 Drug/Narcotic Violations

Drug/Alcohol Usage in 2009






Adult Drug/Narcotic Arrests 5 Year Trend

These offenses are categorized under two types of criminal activity: 1) Prostitution, which is to unlawfully engage in sexual relations for profit. 2) Assisting/promoting prostitution, which is defined as to solicit customers or transport persons for prostitution purposes; to own, manage, or operate a dwelling or other establishment for the purpose of providing a place where prostitution is performed; or to otherwise assist or promote prostitution.





Weapons Law Violations by Type of Weapon in 2009




