




Drug/Narcotic Arrests by Age in 2012

Drug/Narcotics Violations 5 Year Trend





19.8% of the total Group "A" incidents reported in 2012 indicated drug and/or alcohol usage during the commission of a crime.




Drug/Alcohol Usage in 2012






Drug/Narcotic Arrests by Gender in 2012



47.7% of the weapons identified in weapon law violations were firearms, of which 8.4% were classified as automatic.


