





Crimes Against Persons in 2015 Gender Comparison















Aggravated Assault Incidents by Type of Weapons Used in 2015









Victims of Intimidation by Age in 2015







35.7% of kidnapping/ abduction victims were under 18 years old. Although the object of a kidnapping may be to obtain money or property, kidnapping is a crime against persons. This offense includes not only kidnapping and abduction, but hostage taking as well. This category is intended to capture information on only the persons actually kidnapped or abducted, not those persons or organizations paying ransoms. Therefore, for each offense of kidnapping, the victims are only the persons taken or detained against their will.

Kidnapping/Abduction Victims by Age in 2015


